In December 2022 our Secretary was contacted by Katie Spragg regarding the plight of her little MT rehome, Crowley. Here is his story by kind permission of Katie.

"We took on this little lad 3 years ago this month [December 2022] via the Official British Manchester Terrier re-home page as a rising 4 year old dog. Tim saw his story and

was smitten!! And drove 7 plus hours to pick him up from Stirling and back. Crowley has Progressive Retinal Atrophy (PRA) (as do his siblings.... Mum and dad were his aunt and uncle!! As well). So, Crowley came in to join Lily and Beau (MTs) and Harvey and StanLee (Pugs) and became very much part of the family. We knew he would finally lose what little sight he had, and that he was at high risk of developing glaucoma.

Sadly following a sudden pain episode Friday evening and a visit to the vets on Monday our worst fears were realized and we have two choices.... Completely remove both eyes or Well simply call it a day and accept that he has had 3 fabulous years with us. We have opted for the first choice and he goes in this morning to have both eyes removed. Tim, I and our amazing vet discussed it in depth and feel he is worth giving him a chance. It's not cheap and yes we didn't really need a big bill this time of year, but we feel he is worth it. He is not the easiest of dogs, he likes to wind his sister Lily up on occasion. But our holidays to the Gower with him when he can kick his heels up and run along the beach with no fear are just amazing and deeply moving. He should cope well after recovery as he is already blind, but following healing will be pain free. This week though we have connected with two of his siblings which has really been a delight.

Crowley's Journey Part 2.... Update:

Firstly Tim and I would like to pass on our sincere thanks for the support and good wishes sent to us. We read every single message and they were really appreciated and brought lumps to our throats.

Tim and I also wish to pass on our sincere thanks to the Friends to the BMTC for their support and kindness.

Crowley's operation went well, and we are not



ashamed to say that we both had a few tears when we first saw him. Our vet and the nurses did try to prepare us, but it was still a shock to see his face shaved and his eyes sewn shut, given

they were such a big facial feature.

We know that this was the right thing to do for him, he had lost any sight he had left but the glaucoma had taken over rapidly and would lead to a lot of pain.

So, its onwards and upwards for the little chap. Today Crowley has come on in leaps and bounds and pretty much back to his old self. And finally, a bonus for the week was connecting with two of Crowley's siblings and seeing their pictures with the family resemblance.
