

British Manchester Terrier Club – Spring 2024 Newsletter


<u>Wispa</u>

Nigel's wife Lesley tells us "We got our first Manchester in 1988, from Neroli de lavis Trafford, and after she had persuaded us to show we had our first Champion. We went on to have eight home bred Champions, plus a Champion bred by us but owned by someone else. Ch Brookstream Beamish held the breed record for a while with

23CCs, we were Top Breeders a few times and achieved Top Dog of the Year. Nigel has judged at Crufts and recently judged at the BMTC Ch show. We still have one MT, at 14 ½ years old."
